Each school review generates a number of key improvement strategies to inform continuous improvement in all state schools. The next steps are...

- Sustain a deep focus on embedding the Explicit Improvement Agenda (EIA) in the next strategic planning cycle, with aspirational targets for the learning gains of all students.
- Further strengthen all staff members' understanding of key signature pedagogies and ensure there are rigorous processes to monitor and evaluate their positive impact on student learning.
- Collaboratively review and refine learning walks and watching others work processes to strengthen the precision of monitoring the implementation of key school practices and approaches supporting the EIA.
- Strengthen teachers' capability in planning and implementing all of the Australian Curriculum cross-curriculum priorities and general capabilities, with a focus on critical and creative thinking and Information and Communication Technology.
